This allows me to focus more of my attention on taking photographs and less on Photoshop.

The choice of subject reflects my love of nature and the outdoors. Landscapes, plants and animals are common subjects. Many of the images are taken while hiking in remote places.?

I've also noticed that some of my best work happens when I least expect it. I may be looking for a certain shot and suddenly notice something completely different in front of me.
